Wednesday 29th February, the eve of his birth date, family, members and friends gathered in the clubhouse and raised glasses to wish Otto 'Many Happy Returns'.


Margaret approaching 90th was also toasted although with a less spectacular cake!


ANZAC DAY



Payment before June 30th please!





Al Qa'eeda To Go On Strike Muslim suicide bombers in Britain are set to begin a three-day strike in a dispute over the number of virgins they are entitled to in the afterlife. Emergency talks with Al Qaeda have so far failed to produce an agreement. The unrest
