



## A fast game is a good game

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With next year's Pennant season looming, the selectors have been watching play by members and draw their attention to the following;

- Rule 13.1 Possession of the rink will belong to the player or team whose bowl is being played.
- Rule 13.2 As soon as each bowl comes to rest, possession of the rink will transfer to the opposing player or team after allowing time for marking a toucher as soon as it comes to rest.

Therefore, you must not move onto the mat until it is yours hence you cannot bowl whilst the previous bowl is in motion. This is quite common at KBC and means that you are bowling without knowing if the head has changed.

Notwithstanding the above, a player should be standing behind the mat and ready to move onto the mat the moment the previous bowl comes to rest. **Do not remain seated waiting for your turn to play.** 



#### **MEASURE IMMEDIATLEY**

If there is doubt about which bowl is the shot, do not stand around discussing the situation or using split fingers to try and gauge which is the shot just measure immediately or, if a decision cannot be quickly reached, call an umpire.

#### **SLOW PLAY IS A DRAG**



When you watch bowls on television you observe how quickly the good players play. Their line up and delivery time is 5 to 10 seconds maximum. We have observed that some of our members are regularly taking 25 to 35 seconds on the mat before

their bowl is delivered. This is totally unnecessary and slows the game down, making it less enjoyable for the other players and we are seeing some games finishing 30 minutes later than adjoining rinks. Slow play is covered by Rule A.5 and an opposing skip might see it as a deliberate "delaying tactic" and appeal to the umpire. The time allowed for an end if a team is "put on the clock" is 4 minutes after the jack has come to rest and been centred so be aware of this. If you are a slow player, you will also find your bowling will improve if you learn how to line up your target point more speedily and all will enjoy their game more.

As I am writing this piece for the newsletter, I cannot believe we are approaching the end of another year. During the last 2 months, Killara women played at St Ives, Pittwater, Neutral Bay and Northmead. *Ngoc* 

*Hau, Louise Amos, Warwick Bridge (Chatswood)* and *Rod Henriks* played at Mona Vale George Vade Mixed 4's and were lucky enough to have won the 3rd prize.



Anne Rands, Julie Dunn, Ngoc Hau and Louise Amos played at Mona Vale Ham and Turkey Carnival and only missed by a couple of points to bring the turkey home! This carnival usually signifies the end of the women carnival season for the year. It has indeed been a busy year. Killara women participated in over 25 carnivals (which included a few mixed inter-club matches kindly invited by Killara men), 6 district competitions as well as various internal club competitions.

Bowls NSW announced in September that from 2020 Bowls NSW Association events will be open to affiliated members of any gender. After discussion at Killara Joint Management Committee, it was decided that Killara men and women will join forces to play mixed pennants in 2020. The other good news is Women Bowls NSW (WBNSW) announced in November that a motion had been passed and action is being taken to work towards the **unification of WBNSW and Bowls NSW.** This is indeed a pleasing, long-awaited news and a positive way forward to make our sport more competitive and to bring our sport to the next level. 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


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

Jean Brierley was real lady. A lady of courage, vivid sense of duty, full of zeal and energy, warm, caring and friendly.

Her early family life was not easy. Jean and her husband John had just set up a caravan park on the South Coast when

he died, but Jean courageously carried on.

Jean had four children. All won scholarships to complete their education. Jean eventually sold the caravan park and bought a house in Killara, but not long after, broke her back riding a child's bike.

It nearly took her life and caused a loss of height, but it did not curb her, evidenced by her achievements on the green.

In September 1982, using borrowed second hand bowls, Jean joined the Killara Bowling Club and promptly won the Minor Singles. Jean's successes on the green were extraordinary as shown opposite.

Apart from her performance on the green, Jean participated in all aspects of the club.

The KWBC elected her to positions of Secretary, Vicepresident, Selector and Chairman of Selectors, Bowls Organiser and District Delegate.

In 1987 she became a National Umpire and later in 1991, a National Coach.

Jean was President of the KWBC from 2008-9, and during her time in office generated a caring, friendly atmosphere. New members were welcomed and encouraged to participate in everything.

Nothing was left to chance.

Jean organised the Trading Table and Raffles at many carnivals. The babies' bootees she knitted for sale, were much sought after.

Jean died on 29 October 2019. Her life was one worth knowing.

Killara Bowling Club salutes her, She now can rest now.


