## PRESIDENT *Tony Gale*

Since the last newsletter, social bowls has resumed to 'normal' activity levels for those fully Covid vaccinated, including the **Thursday First National Johnson Triples event**.

Remaining Club Championship matches are progressing well and congratulations to **Tony Hunt** and **Anne Rands** who are our 2021 men's and women's single champions. Unfortunately, NSW COVID restrictions significantly impacted our overall Club Championship schedule so we were unable to commence Triples, Fours and Gissing competitions. Killara had entered a team to participate in the **Roseville Shield** at Lindfield BC on Saturday 27th November, however unfortunately adverse weather caused play to be cancelled on the day. The next inter-club event is the **Langker Painting Trophy** at Warrawee BC on Wednesday 2nd February – a signup sheet is on the clubhouse noticeboard, noting this is a mixed triples event requiring 18 players. Our Selectors will advise team list by late January. This will be followed by the **Tapner Tournament** at St Ives BC commencing 20th February.

The inaugural **Quarterly Super Thursday** event will be scheduled for Thursday 31st March with an attractive guaranteed winner's prize on-the-day to encourage more members and visitors to participate. **First National Johnson has very kindly agreed to provide \$500 sponsorship.** These quarterly events will replace the traditional Spring and Autumn Carnival's which were resource intensive to coordinate and providing minimal financial benefit.

The JMC agreed that the **Cyril South** competition should be scheduled for March – June given there is no competing Pennants commitments. Moving forward this will be a mixed event. Invitations will be forwarded to clubs by the Bowls Secretary.

BNSW has realigned the bowls year from calendar to financial year commencing 1st July 2022 so there will be no Zone 9 pennants in the March to May period as for past years. A single gender 6 round pennants competition will commence in late August and a 10 round open gender pennants competition will commence in late February 2023. Further details to follow once the Zone 9 Calendar is released.

KBC (Men's Club) Annual General Meeting will be convened on Saturday 5th February commencing 11.30am. Nomination Forms for office holders have been placed on the clubhouse noticeboard.

Wishing everyone a Merry Christmas and hopefully a less disruptive year ahead. Happy bowling!
