The Effects of Covid on Killara Bowling Club

Two lengthy NSW Covid restriction periods during 2021 caused major disruptions to bowling activities and member participation at our regular bowling days, with a notable reduction in overall bowling numbers.

The graduated resumption of bowls from mid-October for fully vaccinated members and visitors was most welcomed and allowed Club Championship matches to proceed and First National Johnson Thursday Triples to re-commence. It also allowed the House Manager to proceed with a clubhouse dinner in November and a pre-Christmas cocktail party in December.

Regrettably, Covid restrictions have prevented popular Jack Attack events from proceeding over the last two years. Despite Covid impacts a number of competitions did occur.

Tapner Tournament

We participated with a 9-player side (1 x pairs, 1 x triples, 1 x fours team) on Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> March at St Ives with overall mixed results. Harbord won the tournament.

#### 2021 Pennants

Killara entered a Grade 5 and a Grade 7 side in the 10 round Pennants Season as well as providing a 4-player team for a Grade 7 Composite side with Warrawee and Seaforth. Round 1 commenced Saturday 6th March. A total of 37 Killara members participated during the season, including 8 women bowlers.

Congratulations to all who participated.

Of interest, Zone 9 commented that there was an inconsistent approach by clubs to providing food/snack to pennant players during the season. At least one club did not provide anything. Killara was viewed as one of the more generous hosts.

Zone 9 intend having a men's pennant competition commencing this August and the normal 10-round mixed pennants season commencing late February 2023.

Langker Painting

The away leg comprising 6 x triple teams per side was played at Warrawee on Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> March. Each club won 3 rinks however Warrawee won on the 'big board' 127-113. Louise, Peter Armstrong, Ian Armstrong were the best KBC team with a +15 margin and won the whiskey.

The home leg at Killara scheduled for 15<sup>th</sup> September was cancelled due to Covid.

Waterman Trophy

Our 9-player side (3 x triple teams) went down to Mosman on Wednesday 31<sup>st</sup> March in a closely contested match. Lindfield Rollers Friendship Day

Killara was scheduled to host Lindfield Rollers on Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> June, however adverse weather caused play to be cancelled on the day.

Roseville Shield

Killara entered a team to participate in the Roseville Shield at Lindfield BC on Saturday 27th November, however adverse weather caused play to be cancelled on the day.

#### Cyril South Competition

The JMC did not proceed with a 2021 competition due to Covid considerations. This event was last hosted by Killara in 2020 and the JMC intends proceeding with 2022 event in April after the Easter long weekend and inviting 6-8 local clubs to participate.

Killara Bowling Club vs Killara Golf Club

The Steadman Trophy was not contested in 2021 due to a combination of Covid and Killara Golf Club not agreeing to our request to make this a mixed event moving forward.

First National Johnson Thursday Triples

Members should be aware that our sponsors are monitoring the business benefit of their continued sponsorship given they have not received a sales or rental opportunity from a Killara member for some time. The Johnson's have also noted the decline in overall participation numbers in the Thursday event, however accept that Covid could have played a part in this. That stated, the Johnson's have committed to continue sponsoring Killara for 2022 and will review at the end of the year.

Super Thursday Triples Event

The JMC received Board approval to replace the traditional Spring & Autumn Carnival (which were very resource intensive and achieved minimal financial in recent years) with a quarterly 'Super Thursday' triples event. For planning purposes, the inaugural quarterly event will be conducted Thursday 31<sup>st</sup> March. The intention is that each event would offer an attractive prize pool that would be awarded on the day (no rollover of a jackpot like the normal Thursday Triples event). <u>The Johnson's</u> have agreed to provide \$500 sponsorship for the first event and depending on its popularity may sponsor other quarterly events moving forward. The Johnson's are happy for Killara to arrange other sponsors for this event to increase the prize pool, provided they are not in real-estate.

#### BNSW/WBNSW Unification

BNSW & WBNSW advised in a joint communication that the two resolutions on unification were unanimously passed state-wide following the 22nd May vote and new Board appointments made to reflect the agreed unified structure. There is no further action on KBC at this time, however we can expect to see some unification initiatives coming through as the year progresses.

#### Closing Comments

We are about to advise the details of the Men's Club office bearers for the year ahead. As many of you are already aware, I will not be standing for re-election as President for personal reasons and wish every success those who have been nominated. I would like to thank our Selectors, Umpires and Coaches for their dedication, persistence and willingness to support the club. Finally, I thank and appreciate all those who have supported me or provided suggestions and guidance during the past year.
